Under the leadership of its chair **Bob Grossman**, the committee has guided a multitude of projects in support of various Israeli causes. First and foremost, our committee has taken responsibility for nurturing and growing our relationship with our beloved sister congregation, Kehilat Har El in Jerusalem. Our partnership with Har El, the very first Reform synagogue in Jerusalem, has benefited both them and us in multiple ways. Their clergy, Rabbi Ada Zavidow and Cantor Evan Cohen, have welcomed our members to Jerusalem countless times and performed numerous *b'nei mitzvah* for TBAM families in Jerusalem. The funds we raise for them are vital to their sustenance and growth, and our committee has done great work to facilitate this important relationship.

Recognizing the importance of Israel to our youth, the TBAM Israel Committee concentrates its efforts on supporting the incredible cause of Birthright Israel. We are delighted that so many in the congregation have supported these efforts.

CLERGY CORNER Rabbi Rachel Greengrass

I love physics. As a child I loved math—it was neat and clean, understandable, and like a game to me. Physics blew my mind, as all of these math equations were suddenly applied to life. Calculating how long it would take an object to fall given its weight, size, wind resistance; how inclined an on-ramp should be.

Perhaps that is why I love Mussar as well, because it is applied Judaism. The Torah tells us "Kedoshim t'hiyu; You shall be holy." But how? Well, the Torah is our guide, reminding us through the mitzvot of how to live. But we can do mitzvot without really changing our middot, our character. Mussar gives us tools to refine our character. And this statement, "You shall be holy," teaches us as well. It is future tense, reminding us that, no matter how many mitzvot we have done, we still have room to grow. A *middah*, while referring to a character trait, really means measurement. This is because every quality we have needs to be in the proper amount. Most of us think about a character trait like honesty and assume we all just need to be more honest. However, there are times when we can be too honest. We all know people who are mean and callous and defend themselves by saying they are just speaking their "truth." Well, if your truth is just your opinion and helps no one-and, in fact, hurts others-then keep your truth to yourself. We see people oversharing online, tweeting about bikini waxes or spreading rumors. It might be true, but that doesn't mean you need to say it.

This is true of trust as well. Most of us need to lean into trust

more. But, you can lean too far and be taken advantage of. Most of us need to be kinder, but we can be too kind to the point of being a doormat, allowing others to violate boundaries, or being dishonest because we don't want to hurt anyone. Mussar helps us keep those *middot* in proper balance. Like the car driving on the on-off ramp—the ramp needs to be sloped just the right amount.

I am sharing this now for two reasons. The first is that we will be having Mussar classes in the fall. Here, we will study different *middot* (character traits) and learn exercises to help us find balance. We will apply Judaism to our lives. Grow in holiness. And second, there is a tradition that every night as the sun sets between Passover and Shavuot, we count the days. It's called counting the Omer. There are 48 middot and 49 days of the Omer. Tradition tells us that we not only count the day, but we focus on refining another character trait. The counting reminds us of what counts. As we count the days, we grow in holiness.

We are in the last week of counting the Omer. Shavuot is the first weekend of June, but that does not mean we are done counting or that we are done growing—because we are never done growing. Judaism gives us a path to grow; we just need to apply it to life.

Finally, I want to thank the Temple Beth Am and Rambam Day School communities for your trust and support over the last two years. It is a privilege to be your Head of School and to partner with each one of our families in order to nurture our world's future Jewish leaders.

I hope everyone has a wonderful summer break. We very much look forward to even brighter days ahead for Rambam Day School.





OUR JEWISH HERITAGE

Time for Tanach, After the Torah

im. Nehemiah

The third section of the Jewish Bible is called Writings, *Ketuvim*. It includes Psalms, Proverbs, Ruth, Esther, Job, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Lamentations, Daniel, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Chronicles 1 and 11. The focus for this month is on Ezra and Nehemiah because it describes the return to Jerusalem and Eretz Yisrael after the Exile in Babylonia.

Ezra and Nehemiah

How was it possible for a people to lose their land, live in exile for many years and then return and become a nation again? Ezra and Nehemiah were important leaders who made it happen. Fifty years after Jerusalem and the Temple had been destroyed, a new leader rose to power, the Persian King Cyrus. He conquered the Babylonian Empire and issued a proclamation in 538 BCE permitting the Jews to return to the land.

The Edict of Cyrus

"The Lord, God of Heavens, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and has charged me to build the Temple in Jerusalem, which is in Judea. Whosoever there is among you who belongs to God's people, let him go up to Jerusalem and build the Temple of the Lord, the God of Israel. Let those who remain in that place help with silver and gold and goods and beasts of burden as well as free will offerings for the Temple of the Lord of Jerusalem."

The first pioneers to return numbered 43,000, under the leadership pf Zerubabbabel and Joshua, according to the text. They found foreign settlers who had adopted the worship of pagan gods, and the Samaritans, who proved to be obstacles. The prophets Haggai and Zechariah encouraged the people with their words to have the courage to complete the task of rebuilding the Temple.

"Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, I will bring My People to dwell in Jerusalem, "I will make the remnant of this people possess the land...and you, house of Judah, shall become a blessing!"

After some time, they completed the building of the Temple, and the priests, the Levites, and the rest of the returned exiles celebrated the dedication of the house of God with joy.

Ezra was a scribe, very religious, and he traced his ancestry back to Aaron. He went to Judea to help his people because he had heard of some of their difficulties. He arrived in Jerusalem in 458 BCE. He was shocked to find that many of the people, including the priests and Levites, had given their daughters and sons to intermarry with the others who lived in the land. He spoke to the people to set aside these marriages, confess, ask forgiveness and return to the laws of the Covenant. Ezra understood that it was necessary to do this in order to restore the nation. The influence of the non Jewish spouses would prevent this from happening. He served as a religious and political leader, however, he is most remembered for being a teacher and scribe. Nehemiah asked permission from the King of Persia, Artaxerxes. to go to Judea as a representative of the King, to govern and establish a stable province of the Persian Empire. He arrived in 445 BCE. He ordered the building of the wall around Jerusalem. It was completed in 52 days. His writings are memoirs of his leadership in the land. He and Ezra worked closely with each other. Together they organized and established a return to Jewish observance, especially about Shabbat, eliminated intermarriage, and unjust financial and social wrongs. All of this is recorded in his book.

The Torah-the Constitution of Judea

Ezra and Nehemiah gave the Jewish people a constitution by which they could guide and govern the new community of Judea. It became the edited version of the five books of Moses, the Torah. In 445 BCE, at a public ceremony, the people pledged their loyalty and faithfulness to the Covenant between themselves and God.

"When the seventh month drew near, the people gathered in the place that was before the Water Gate; and they spoke to Ezra to bring the book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded to Israel. Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, and the people stood up. Ezra read from morning until midday, and the people listened carefully...the Levites instructed the people and explained its meaning. Then Nehemiah and Ezra, the priests and the Levites, said to the people, **This day is holy to the Lord your God**, do not weep, go your way, eat and drink, send a portion to those who have nothing, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

The Torah since then, is the Torah we read today, every week. Ezra also gets credit for establishing the reading of Torah on Monday, Thursday and Shabbat.

About Cyrus

After Cyrus, King of Persia, conquered the Babylonian Empire, he established a period of religious tolerance in his empire. Deported peoples were allowed to return to their homelands, and they were allowed to practice their national faiths. One of the groups were the Jews. As a result, Cyrus has earned a place in Jewish history as one of the righteous among the gentiles. I encourage you to read some selections from the Tanach during the summer. I have used many sources during the year to bring you selections from the Tanach. As always, as I prepare for this page each month, I learn and relearn new ideas about each topic. To learn and to teach, has always been my commitment to you.




