Many weeks before the terrible calamity that befell our people on October 7th, we planned at Temple Beth Am a program called Letters from Anne and Martin. The event will take place at the Hub on December 4th at 7 PM. Letters from Anne and Martin bring heroes Anne Frank and Martin Luther King, Jr. to life on stage sharing their hopes and plans for a peaceful and unified world. These icons, both born in 1929, have distinct and eloquent voices, expressing a deep belief in humanity despite their lived experiences facing hatred and oppression. The evening highlights the parallels in their outlooks and ideals, demonstrating the universality of the human experience.

In the play we see scenes of Dr. King alone in a Memphis jail juxtaposed with Anne Frank isolated in the attic hiding place during the Holocaust. Reflecting on their incredible lives that will continue to touch people forever, I often try to imagine how they were able to see a larger world from their isolated positions. Dr. King, like a prophet, dreamed of a better world. He pictured in his mind what a world without racism and hatred would look like, and then he spent his life trying to make that dream come true. Anne Frank gazed out from a crack in the window on a world that rejected her and her people. Down below at street level, she saw people who had the freedom to come and go as they pleased. All the while, a cough or a loud noise could reveal her hiding place and result in death for the crime of being Jewish. Nevertheless, through her writing we know that somehow, in her mind, she transcended hatred and yearned for a world of peace.

As the conflict in Israel rages on, Jews around the world are besieged by more than Hamas and Hizbullah. There is also an outcry of those who support the Palestinian cause. The horrific images coming from college campuses, rallies around the country, and rioting in Arab countries causes us to feel isolated. The constant barrage of anti-Israel and antisemitic rhetoric is unceasing, and certainly there are moments when we feel isolated and afraid. It is in these moments when we must recall the courage and prophecy of Dr. King and Anne Frank. As they sat alone in distress, there was one thing that lifted their spirits and allowed them to envision a better time. What they each knew is something that must continue to reverberate in our minds and our souls. It is the same thing that Martin and Anne knew. It is, that our cause is just! It is that the Jewish people deserve a nation like all other peoples, and we deserve to defend it just like anyone else would. Today we may feel isolated. But with Dr. King and Anne Frank, we are in good company with those who transcend the hatred of others and look forward to a better day. This is something we will never cease to do, no matter how loud the voices of the other side shout in vain.

SHINING LIGHT ON EATING DISORDERS: A CALL TO COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Since 2010, I've had the privilege of overseeing the b'nai mitzvah program at three different synagogues, guiding over one thousand pre-teens as they prepare to lead a service, read from the Torah, and transition into Jewish adulthood. However, the journey to becoming a confident and self-assured Jewish adult at the age of thirteen is not without its challenges.

Confidence is the key trait I strive to instill in these young individuals, as it empowers them to succeed in leading their service and navigating the tumultuous waters of middle school. Confidence to make friends, speak with clarity and conviction, proudly sing their prayers, and articulate the significance of their Jewish identity. Confidence to be authentic, foster connections, and stand up for what is just. Confidence in their bodies and the understanding that true beauty emanates from their unique personalities.

In today's society, the pressure placed on physical appearance is undeniable. Coupled with certain personality traits, this has contributed to a rising prevalence of eating disorders, often concealed and unaddressed within our community. One of my primary goals is to shed light on the presence of eating disorders in the Jewish community and offer preventive programming and spiritual guidance to those suffering from the disorders. My approach blends the wisdom of our Jewish tradition with my training as an eating disorder coach from the Carolyn Costin Institute.

I volunteer for Project Heal, an organization committed to dismantling systemic barriers to eating disorder healing. In the United States alone, over 30 million Americans struggle

with eating disorders, yet only 20% receive treatment due to financial issues, insurance barriers, and systemic biases. I have the privilege to coach individuals nationwide, showing them that recovery is possible. With these qualifications and experiences, I am enthusiastic about becoming a valuable resource for our community, offering prevention strategies, support groups, and active care for those battling eating disorders.

My blessing for our synagogue is that it becomes a sanctuary where all members can share their authentic selves with others, allowing their souls to shine. Rather than solely focusing on improving body image, I believe in nurturing a deep appreciation for our bodies as vessels that house our true essence – our personalities and souls. Our bodies deserve care to the extent that they need to be strong and healthy, enabling us to forge meaningful relationships and lead fulfilling lives driven by our unique purposes.

If you or someone you know is grappling with disordered eating, chronic dieting or exercising, anorexia, bulimia, or binge eating disorder, I am here to offer spiritual healing and coaching. I can also assist in finding the right resources, including therapists, dietitians, and programs, to support the recovery journey of our community members. This is a deep-seated passion of mine, and it would be an honor to extend my help and support.

To My Temple Beth Am Community,

I hope this message finds you and your loved ones safe and well. It is with a heavy heart and a deep sense of responsibility that I write to you today concerning the recent Hamas attack in Israel.

One of the unfortunate inefficiencies of having the Commentator physically printed each month is that, as I sit here and write to you today in these uncertain times, one thing that is certain is that the incomprehensible situation in Israel will be vastly different when you read this. Consequently, I hope this message rings as true when you read it as it did when I wrote it; I apologize if it does not.

For context, my wife Jackie, daughters Allison and Abby, and I departed JFK on October 6 for our first “real” family vacation since the pandemic – Italy for my birthday! Arriving Saturday morning, we were on our way to our hotel when our devices all started vibrating with “breaking news” from Israel. As we read the early accounts, it soon became clear to me that this was something far different than Hamas’ “normal” acts of aggression against our homeland, which are typically defended by the Iron Dome and followed by a tactical response from the IDF and, ultimately, a ceasefire. No, this was different. The most uneasy part for me was that, as I was continually monitoring the “live updates” (which grew more frequent and more ominous), I realized that just about everyone I cared about on the planet was asleep and unaware of what was transpiring. It was as if I was getting a “sneak preview” of a tragedy that no one was yet aware of, and it sickened me...

These shocking events had me put aside my Commentator article I had just written on our “great ideas” initiative (which was the theme of my remarks at our Rosh Hashanah services) and write this column quickly and while many of the facts are still unfolding. Nevertheless, and despite what occurs between today and the day this is published, there is much about which we can all agree.

First and foremost, words cannot adequately describe the devastation we all feel from Hamas’ inhumane and unforgivable acts perpetrated against our beloved Israel and its people, including the many innocent civilians who were killed and taken captive. The horror and sadness we are all feeling is unlike anything I have ever experienced and, while I don’t believe “ranking tragedies” is a worthwhile effort, for me personally these events are more disturbing than September 11th, to which the invasion of Israel is often being compared. I am profoundly concerned that Israel is currently facing an existential threat that I have not

experienced in my lifetime, a threat we must overcome with every resource we can bring to bear.

As Jews, we are bound not only by our faith but also by the enduring principles of justice, compassion, and peace. These recent events remind us of the complex and deeply rooted challenges facing the people of Israel and Jews everywhere. Our community condemns these vicious and unprovoked attacks and stands in solidarity with the people of Israel – our brothers, sisters, and friends who are there, and all those protecting the country we hold dear and call home.

Our hearts go out to the innocent lives affected by the violence, and we fervently pray for a swift resolution to the conflict. At the same time, we must also remember our duty to stand together as a community and advocate for a just resolution to this ongoing crisis. In the face of adversity, it is essential that we reaffirm our commitment to the values that define us. We must engage in constructive dialogue, educate ourselves about the complexities of the situation, and actively support initiatives that promote peace, tolerance, and understanding.

I encourage all of you to stay informed about the Israeli situation, engage in thoughtful discussions, and seek ways to make a positive impact, whether through donations to organizations providing humanitarian aid or by advocating for solutions within our broader communities. While I appreciate and support the common sentiment at the moment that one cannot “negotiate with terrorists”, it is also true that we now stand with most of the civilized world in our corner to not only avenge the atrocities rained down upon us but to instill fundamental changes to ensure that no people of any religion, race or nationality should ever have to face the brutality we witnessed in recent days.

Let us also come together as a congregation to offer our prayers and support to Israel during this difficult time. Our faith teaches us that, while the pursuit of peace is a sacred duty, so is the defense of our people and homeland. From this, our commitment cannot diverge. As we navigate these challenging times, Temple Beth Am stands by and supports unconditionally our State of Israel in her time of need – let us stand united in our commitment to justice, compassion, and the enduring hope for a better future.

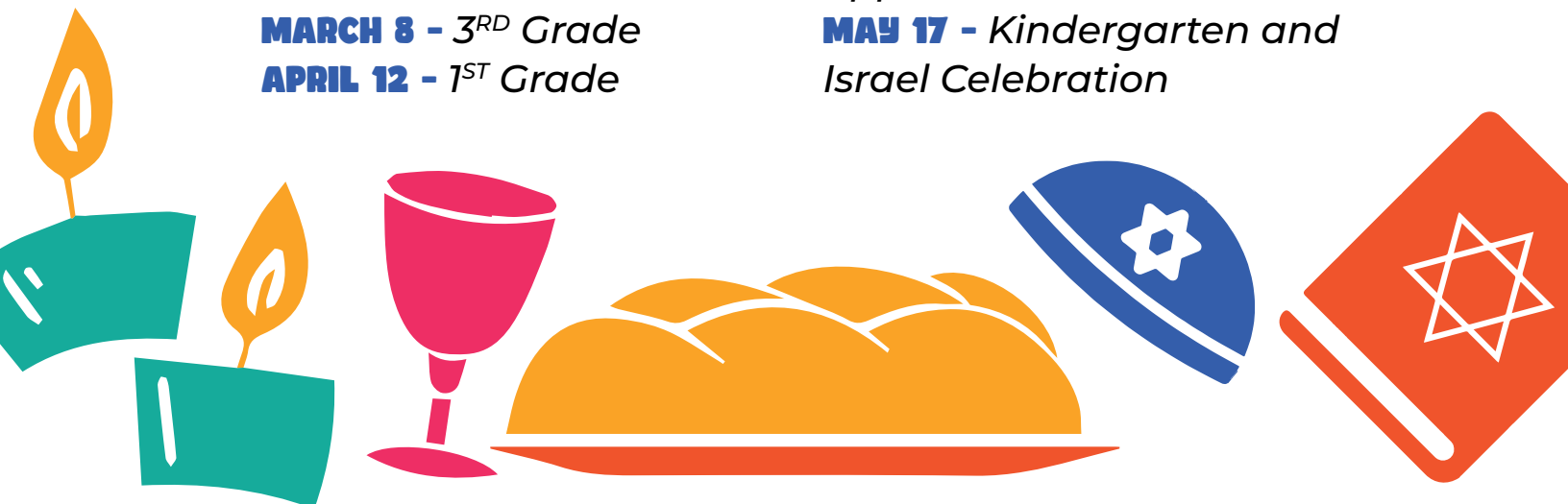

Ten years ago, Temple Beth Am had 67 engaged teens. With its trip to Washington D.C., the Confirmation class was the only trip the department offered, giving teens a unique opportunity to explore how government works and advocate for the issues close to their hearts. A decade later, our Youth Engagement and Religious School (YERS) department expanded not only its offering but also traveling experiences starting from 8th grade and beyond, with our teen population nearly tripling.

These journeys take our teens to destinations as diverse as Israel, Memphis, Washington D.C., Guatemala, the Dominican Republic, and—during this Thanksgiving week—our inaugural multigenerational trip to Poland. What sets these trips apart is their profound connection with educational sessions, creating a strong foundation of knowledge that amplifies the impact of experiential learning. The result? Stronger, more informed Jews, kinder teens, and thoughtful individuals better equipped to contribute positively to the world.

Despite the remarkable growth and success of YERS, it remains a small operation. However, its impact on our teens, peers, and families is immeasurable.

Teen trips are life-changing experiences that mold our young people into compassionate, responsible, and engaged citizens of the world. Here are some of the ways in which these journeys make a difference:

1. PERSONAL GROWTH: Teen trips challenge participants to step out of their comfort zones, fostering personal growth and self-discovery. Teens develop resilience, adaptability, and a sense of independence that will serve them well in their future endeavors.

2. CULTURAL UNDERSTANDING: Traveling to different parts of the world exposes teens to diverse cultures, traditions, and perspectives. This firsthand exposure promotes empathy, tolerance, and a broader worldview, essential qualities for building a more inclusive society.

3. COMMUNITY BUILDING: Through shared experiences and challenges, teens form deep and lasting bonds with their peers on these trips. These

friendships often extend beyond the duration of the trip and create a sense of belonging within the Temple Beth Am community.

4. JEWISH IDENTITY: All of our trips have a strong Jewish focus, allowing teens to connect with their heritage meaningfully. This connection can have a lifelong impact, inspiring a commitment to Jewish values and traditions.

5. FAMILY CONNECTIONS: The influence of these trips extends far beyond the individual teen. Parents and siblings witness the transformation of their loved ones and often become more engaged in the temple community as a result.

6. ADVOCACY AND CIVIC ENGAGEMENT: Trips like the one to Washington D.C., Guatemala, or the Dominican Republic empower teens to become active citizens who understand the importance of participating in the democratic process. These experiences nurture the development of responsible young adults who are attuned to societal inequities and ready to take action. They learn to advocate for issues they care about, fostering a sense of agency and accountability.

In 2023, our mission remains clear: we are in the business of making “mensches”—kind, compassionate, and ethical individuals. 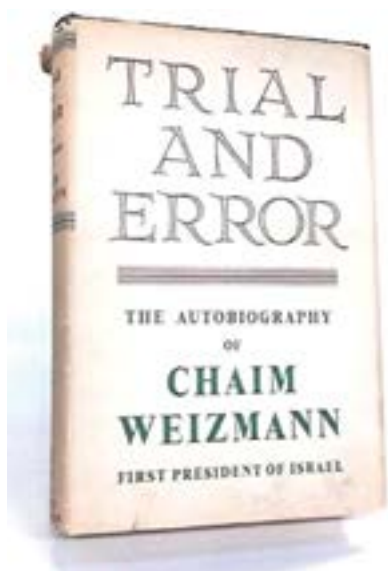

RAC-FL UPDATE RELIGIOUS ACTION CENTER

The Temple Beth Am team has been busy collecting petitions through the holiday season to put reproductive rights on the ballot in Florida in 2024. Our group collected petitions at the book release event for Rabbi Barras, at the first day of Religious School, at the Brotherhood and Sisterhood Opening Events, and through Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot. Many thanks to our many great volunteers who are making it all happen.

Temple Beth Am been responsible for collecting more than 1,000 petition signatures. Overall, the coalition has collected more than 700,000 petitions out of a necessary 1 million.

We are part of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism – Florida (RAC-FL), which consists of over 30 active reform congregations in Florida, who have committed to gathering 80,000 valid petitions. RAC-FL is part of the statewide coalition, Floridians Protecting Freedom.

RAC-FL has engaged more than 550 team leaders from over 30 Florida congregational teams. We will continue to collect signatures through the end of December.

Never has Temple Beth Am and RAC-FL had such a robust infrastructure or engaged as many Floridians in social justice work. We are part of history in the making!

A TEMPLE BETH AM ANTISEMITISM INITIATIVE

On Yom Kippur, both Rabbi Barras and Rabbi Greengrass devoted their sermons to the ever-increasing rise of antisemitism in our country. In his sermon, Rabbi Barras hypothesized that the number of Americans who harbor xenophobic views is about 20%, while another 20% of Americans support freedom and equality for all. The middle 60% are the silent bystanders.

Our challenge is to move the 60% toward the 20% that do not have racist or xenophobic views. In his call to save the soul of our nation, he reminded us how quickly German democracy unraveled when Hitler came to power, allowing 99% of the population to blame all of Germany's post-WWI problems on the 1% Jewish population.

The goal of our unBIASed Antisemitism Initiative is to reach and move that other 60% to action. Although in its infancy, our program is working to create and nourish relationships with the "silent bystanders." This task is not easy, but we are gradually charting a path and making inroads. You can work with us by attending the events we are planning with our community partners and helping identify and enlist our non-Jewish neighbors to participate with us. Each of us has a pool of friends, colleagues, and neighbors to draw from. Your participation and outreach are the most valuable assistance you can give this cause. It is imperative that we share our culture and beliefs so our community understands who we are.

I am pleased to report that news about TBAM's unBIASed Initiative has been spreading. We have been called for information, and we have been called upon to partner with other groups. Recently, the AJC announced its latest step in helping Implement the U.S. National Strategy to Counter Antisemitism, tapping more than 35 lay leaders from across the country to join the implementation task force. Because of Beth Am's leadership in this area, I was invited to participate and will proudly share our work with that group and carry new ideas back to Beth Am.

How fortunate we are as a congregation to have clergy that inspires us to dig deep and address wrongs as we see them. Thank you, Rabbi Jeremy Barras, for

promoting the concept of a continuing antisemitism initiative at Temple Beth Am. Thank you to Rabbi Aklepi, who attends all of our meetings and supports us in so many ways. And thank you to Rabbi Greengrass, whose Social Justice program at Beth Am is aligned with our unBIASed Antisemitism Initiative.

JEW'S DON'T COUNT

During three recent sessions, Sisterhood's Cultural Competency group joined with our unBIASed Antisemitism Initiative to explore and discuss the ideas and principles of the book *Jews Don't Count* by British writer and comedian David Baddiel.

Baddiel questions why extremists on both the left and the right do not consider Jews to be members of a group that experiences racism and prejudice. He also wonders why Jews are dismissed as having experienced oppression and, at times, even considered the oppressor. In addition, he posits that Jews are also depicted as being less than human! Baddiel speaks about these age-old antisemitic tropes often held by those very people fighting for the oppressed.

In a world where microaggressions against other minorities are rightly taken seriously, macroaggressions against Jews don't count! Rabbi Jaimie Aklepi facilitated the highly spirited debates around these questions. Have you read this book? **WHAT DO YOU THINK?**

GOOD NEWS ON BLACK AND JEWISH COMMUNITIES FIGHTING HATRED TOGETHER

Recently, AJC announced the re-launching of the Congressional Caucus on Black-Jewish relations. Co-chaired by Representatives Debbie Wasserman-Schultz (D-FL), Nikema Williams (D-GA), and Wesley Hunt (R-TX), the caucus hopes to revive the long history of America's Black and Jewish communities fighting hatred and prejudice alongside one another.

TBAM supports the creation of alliances with Black and Jewish communities. Our Community Outreach committee is actively working on building cross-community alliances.

In furtherance of building alliances, the unBIASed Initiative, along with its community partners, is presenting a performance of the two-person show *Letters from Anne and Martin*. DID YOU KNOW?

Last month, President Biden instructed eight cabinet departments to extend civil rights protection to victims of antisemitism and other forms of religious bigotry.

In addition, U.S. Department of Education members are conducting a listening tour of college campuses around the country to understand the Jewish students' experiences regarding antisemitic acts.

These actions represent a significant expansion of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and are in keeping with the initiative against antisemitism announced by the President in May of this year. TBAM's unBIASed Antisemitism Initiative is aligned with the four pillars of the White House Strategy to Counter Antisemitism.

A MESSAGE FROM *Our Sister Congregation*

Dear Friends at Temple Beth Am,

As I sit down to write this month's column (between Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur), I wanted to take the opportunity to share the great news that following an invitation from Rabbi Jeremy Barras, I will be visiting Temple Beth Am this coming Chanukah, Thursday-Sunday, December 7-10, 2023! It's been five years since my last visit, and I'm very much looking forward to seeing old friends, making new acquaintances, sharing my experiences of "praying with my feet" at the protests to preserve Israel as both a Jewish and democratic state, and helping to deepen the connection between our two congregations.

My visit will include joining Temple Beth Am for Shabbat worship at "Glow Stick Shabbat" on Friday, December 8, attending the Saturday morning minyan on December 9, participating in programs with the religious school, and more. I would also be delighted to meet with any families who would like to learn more about celebrating a bat/bar mitzvah in Israel. Please feel free to reach out to me directly at cantorevan@kharel.org.il.

With the holiday season in full swing, and having returned home this evening following a final planning meeting for Yom Kippur and then a protest in front of the American consulate (scheduled to run parallel to President Biden's meeting with Prime Minister Netanyahu on the sidelines of the United Nations assembly), I wanted to share one of the highlights so far which happened to be at the weekly Saturday evening protests across from the President's residence. Israelis' choice of noisemaker for these protests is a "zambura" (a loan word from Arabic), a very loud and obnoxious plastic horn that is very popular at soccer games. Being a cantor, I, however, chose to bring with me what I call the "biblical zambura," also known to us Jews as a shofar, with the added bonus that it would be a great way to practice leading up to the high holidays. So, two weeks ago, I was at the regular Saturday evening protest in Jerusalem. After having led our movement's Havdalah ceremony (attended by members of the five Jerusalem congregations attending the protest together with a growing number of "walk-ins"), I made my way closer to the main stage to hear one of the speakers

whom I knew personally and also happened to be a fellow Reform Jew. There, I bumped into architect Moshe Shapira, a modern Orthodox Jew who is very involved in the same protests and also happens to be the architect for our sanctuary renovations. Like me, he also had a shofar in his hand, and so when recognizing me, he immediately called me over to join him and half a dozen other shofar blowers who were going to blow the shofar on the main stage near the end of the protest. And as we gathered behind the stage with us, there

were not only other male Orthodox shofar blowers but women as well! Noticing that I was surprised, Moshe told me that the point of "Habayit Hameshutaf" (English: "The Shared Home," which is the name of the main Jerusalem protest group) is that we're all in this together, despite our different approaches to religious practice. And that *davka*, each group should be represented here on the main stage. So it was, men and women standing together, from Orthodox to Reform, blowing the shofar as a wake-up call to all of Israel and asking for God's mercy at this critical time.

Journey to Israel 75: Understand the Past, Look to the Future

The Cease Fire Armistice of 1949 with the Arab nations did not end the ongoing challenges and changes that Israel had to face. In fact, it was the beginning of the first decade of being an independent nation. What were some of the immediate problems?

Borders and Boundaries

It is important to remember that the cease fire agreements did not establish permanent boundaries. Egypt controlled the Sinai Peninsula and Gaza. Jordan controlled the territory called the West Bank of the Jordan River, and the ancient city of Jerusalem. Syria controlled the Golan Heights. Israel was able to hold on to the northern Galilee, the Negev, the Coastal Plain, and the road to connect to the new section of Jerusalem. They did gain some territory inland along the coastal plain, that made it safer for the communities. Still, from that border, it was nine miles to Netanyah. Israel continued to have attacks from Arab groups. The Syrians looked down on the Huleh Valley and Lake Kinneret, shelling and attacking the kibbutzim in that area. Palestinian camps in Gaza and the West Bank became breeding grounds for raids into Israel. They were called Fedayeen. Israel built a line of army nachal settlements along the borders in an attempt to keep the attacks from entering the interior settlements and the cities. Between 1951 and 1956, 1,300 civilian citizens were killed.

Absorption of European Holocaust Survivors and Refugees from Arab Lands

Although the Yishuv, Jewish self-government under the British Mandate, had prepared for statehood, there was so much they had to do to absorb all the immigrants and at the same time, defend the security of the land. They faced enormous economic and social problems. How do you integrate the Jews from so many nations, with diverse cultural backgrounds and languages into a united nation? The financial assistance from Diaspora Jewish communities helped settle the new immigrants, giving them the basics of food, clothing, shelter, education and employment. New towns were built, agricultural settlements established, and desert areas reclaimed in the Negev to build kibbutzim. The big challenge was to teach everyone Hebrew as quickly as possible. The German Government agreed to pay Israel \$845 million in reparations to assist the 500,000 survivors. The estimate of Palestinian refugees who fled to Arab lands was around 700,000. The estimate of Jewish refugees from Arab lands was around 650,000, from Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, and Yemen.

The Sinai Battle of 1956

In 1956 President Nasser of Egypt expelled the British from the

Suez Canal Zone. The British and French planned to retake the Canal. Russia supplied Egypt with troops and tanks as Egypt built airfields in Sinai and prevented Israeli ships from passing through the Straits of Tiran into the Gulf of Eilat. In eight days Israel had taken all of the Sinai Desert and its fortifications. Due to pressure from the United Nations and the United States, they were forced to withdraw, in exchange for a UN security guarantee of free passage through the Gulf of Aqaba. The UN also took control over Gaza and promised to control terrorist activities of the Fedayeen. From that time until today, Gaza continues to be a source of terrorism, especially now that Hamas is in control.

The Causes that led to the Six Day War of 1967

From 1956 to 1967 Syria continued shelling the settlements of the Huleh Valley. In 1964 Jordan and Syria planned to divert the waters of the Jordan River so that Israel would lose the water supply. In May 1967 Nasser ordered the United Nations Force to leave Sinai and Gaza, and they did. This was a betrayal of the agreements from 1956. On May 20 Nasser concentrated 100,000 troops and 1,000 tanks at Israel's border. On May 22 he closed the Gulf of Eilat (Akaba) to Israeli ships. King Hussein of Jordan signed a pact pledging to support Egypt. Israel faced an Arab force of 200,000 men and 2,000 tanks and 700 fighter planes. The Western Countries and the UN did nothing. Israel began its defensive air attack, and within three hours destroyed 381 planes on the ground. By June 8, Israel had control of the entire Sinai, all the way to the Suez Canal.

Jordan joined the attack, shelling Jerusalem. Israel responded and pushed the Jordanians back to the Jordan River, taking control of Jerusalem and the territories called the West Bank. By June 10 Israel captured all of the Golan Heights from Syria. The results were extraordinary. Israel now had secure boundaries. The most important result was that Jerusalem became a united city, the old and the new. Mayor Teddy Kollek

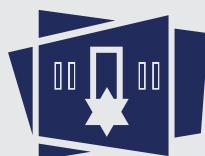

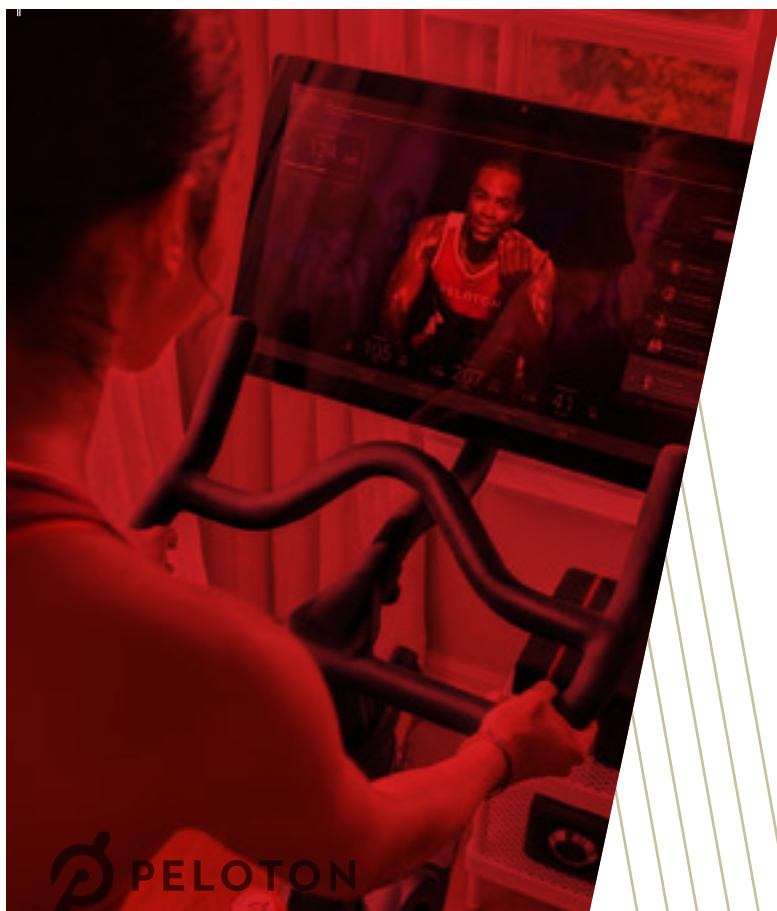

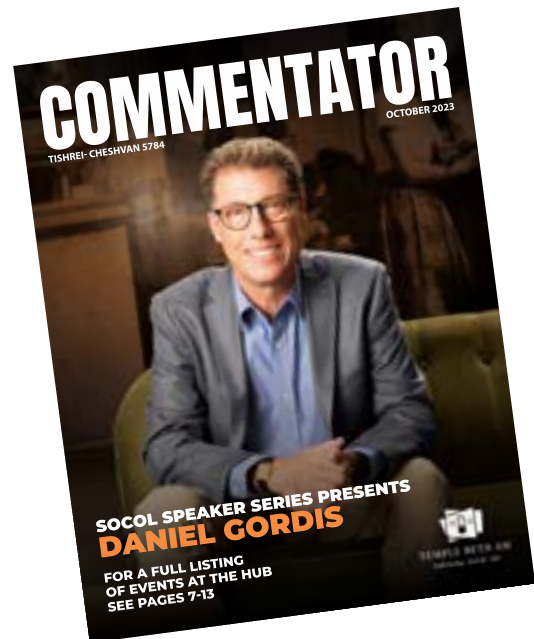
