STATEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

As I conclude another year as Executive Director of Temple Beth Am, I am proud of the remarkable strides we have made together in strengthening Temple Beth Am, Rambam Day School, Religious School, and The Hub as pillars of our community's future.

I would like to begin by expressing my deep gratitude to our clergy, our dedicated administrative team, and the extraordinary lay leaders and congregants whose commitment makes everything we do possible. Our membership remains strong, with over 1,844 families — including 228 new members this year, and an additional 70 families joined our temple community from Temple Beth Or.

Rambam Day School has reached an impressive enrollment of 619 students, a meaningful increase from last year, while our Religious School now serves over 400 children. Our swimming program continues to be a model of inclusion, with more than 227 registered classes and an exceptional 90% participation rate from the Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) community. For the second consecutive year, we were honored to partner with Miami-Dade County to host the countywide Inclusive Family Friendly Fun Day for Autism Awareness Month, bringing together over 14 organizations in a celebration of our shared commitment to every member of our community.

The Hub has had another outstanding year, selling out five events and welcoming a stellar lineup of comedians, authors, and speakers, including Alex Edelman, Matt Friend, Michael Rappaport, Dr. Jill Biden, and our own Judge Roy Altman. The Hub continues to be a vibrant cultural destination that brings our community and the broader public together.


The Beth Am Basketball League achieved record growth once again, reaching 643 registrations per semester — more than 80 additional children compared to last year — with nearly 40% of participants coming from outside the Temple community. This growth reflects how our programs serve as a gateway, welcoming families of all backgrounds into our community.

This year also saw the completion of several important campus projects that enhance our spaces and our identity. The Mango Grove Playground, reserve planting, new Temple entrance signs, a podcast studio, and plaza tree planting all represent our ongoing investment in the physical home we share.

As antisemitism and security concerns continue to rise nationally and globally, we have responded with resolve. We have strengthened our security infrastructure, enhanced our technology systems, and refined our operational protocols to ensure that Temple Beth Am remains a safe and secure home for every family.

I am deeply grateful for the continued trust and support of this community, and I look forward with great excitement to what lies ahead. We will keep building a warm, welcoming, and inclusive home for all.

Together we continue to grow, inspire, and secure a bright future for our families.

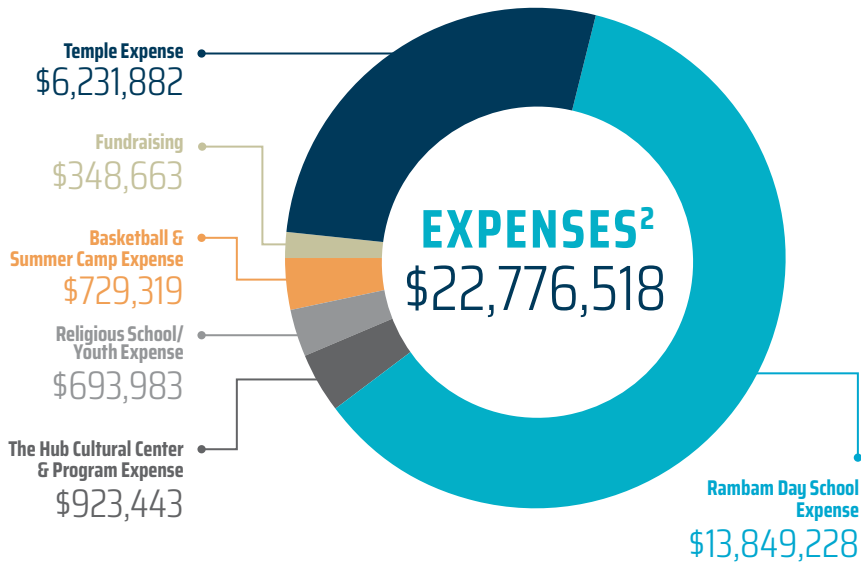
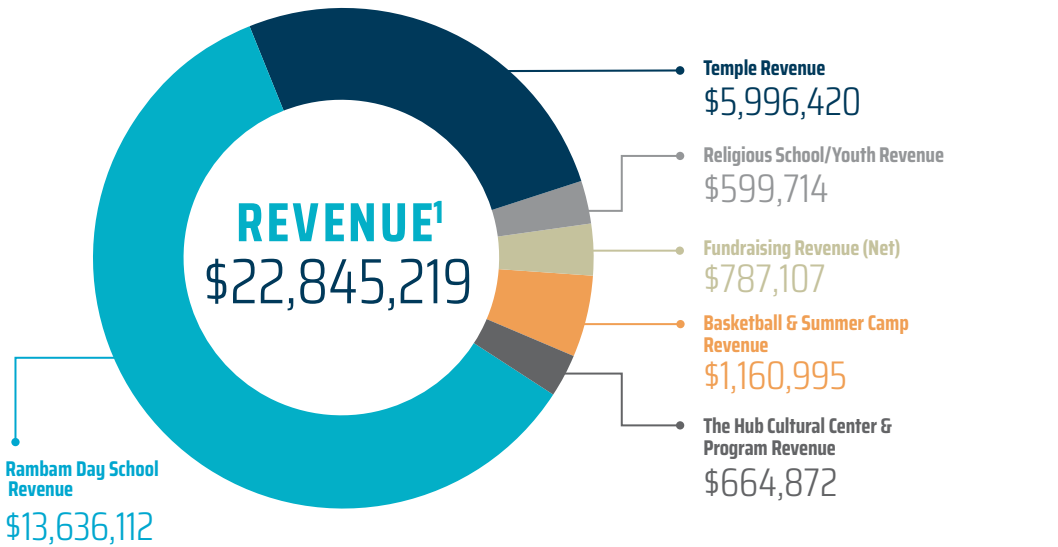
